I TEMPI SONO CAMBIATI, **L'UFFICIO È LIGHT!**

I luoghi contemporanei del lavoro sono radicalmente cambiati. Nell'era della società liquida, anche l'ufficio ha mutato volto, per adattarsi a nuovi modi di lavorare, alle nuove tecnologie e ai nuovi ritmi delle persone. Il luogo di lavoro, quindi, non è più uno spazio tradizionale, con postazioni allineate e sequenziali. Ma è uno spazio articolato e leggero, multifunzionale e flessibile. Light Office.

Lapalma ha saputo cogliere il cambiamento, puntando sulla trasversalità dei suoi prodotti, che si adattano con facilità alle necessità di questi spazi, seguendo un processo di industrializzazione "custom oriented". E' questa un'idea nuova di ufficio leggero, che assembla con grande libertà arredi e moduli variabili, sceglie

diverse texture e finiture, accosta tessuti e materiali evocativi, compone gli spazi in modo fluido.

Una seduta da ufficio, allora, non avrà più soltanto un unico modello. Grazie alla possibilità di variare ogni sua parte – schienale, braccioli, gambe, stoffe, materiali – diventa una famiglia di prodotti molto versatile, capace di rispondere a molteplici configurazioni spaziali e diverse esigenze organizzative: la sala d'aspetto, la seduta per riunioni, la sedia direzionale, la postazione operativa.

Grazie all'abaco articolato dei prodotti Lapalma, si possono comporre e abbinare, con grande flessibilità, elementi di arredo, scrivanie e tavoli a diverse altezze, contenitori da ufficio e accessori funzionali, per creare un

ufficio a propria misura e in linea con i tempi.

Lapalma reinventa un ufficio contemporaneo e disinvolto, con arredi minimal che si riscaldano nei dettagli, nei materiali, nella scelta cromatica. Nella sua linea di prodotti per il Light Office, Lapalma propone un nuovo concetto di spazio di lavoro, dove le gerarchie sono sfumate, le funzioni non sono più rigidamente separate e il comfort diventa più informale e democratico: il cliente si siede su una panca imbottita, i documenti sono riposti in armadi colorati, il cablaggio è collocato in contenitori sollevati da terra. Con leggerezza, l'ufficio è cambiato: Time is changed, the office is light!

TIMES ARE CHANGING, OFFICE IS LIGHT !

Contemporary working places have totally changed. In the age of a more fluid society, the office too has changed and has adapted itself to the new ways of working, new technologies and the new rhythm of people. The work place is therefore no longer a traditional space with regimented desking, but a light, well-structured, multifunctional and flexible space. It is a Light Office.

Lapalma are able to capture this need for change by offering a range of cross-over products which can be easily adapted to the spaces and by using their established industrial processes set up to provide customized solutions.

This is a new idea of light office, which freely combines furniture with flexible elements, choosing different textures and finishes, matching fabrics with suggestive materials to configure the spaces in a fluid way.

An office chair then will not just be a single model; thanks to the possibility of changing each of its parts – backrest, arms, base, fabric, materials - it becomes a multipurpose family of products, capable of responding to many spatial configurations and new organization requirements: the waiting room, the meeting room, the executive chair, the task chair.

Thanks to the range and variety of Lapalma's products, seating, tables, desks can be combined, matched with functional storage to make a tailored office for the contemporary time.

Lapalma reinvents a contemporary and relaxed office, offering furniture of a clean design but also genial and inviting with careful attention to detail and a range of finishes and fabrics with warmth and colour.

With its range for the Light Office, Lapalma suggests a new concept of shared work space, where hierarchies are blended, functions are no longer strictly separated and comfort becomes informal and democratic. With lightness, the lifting of formality, the office has changed: times are changing, the office is light !

DIE ZEITEN ÄNDERN SICH, DAS BÜRO WIRD LIGHT !

Die Arbeitslandschaft hat sich in den letzten Jahren grundlegend verändert. In einer im ständigen Wandel begriffenen Gesellschaft, verändert sich auch das Erscheinungsbild der Arbeitsplätze. Sie werden an neue Arbeitsformen und -rhythmen angepasst und tragen den neuen Kommunikationsmitteln Rechnung. Das klassische Büro mit Schreibtischen in Reih und Glied weicht immer mehr einem offenen, multifunktionalen Raum, der nach Bedarf flexibel gestaltet werden kann: das „Light Office“.

Lapalma hat diese Veränderungen wahrgenommen und entwirft daher vielseitig einsetzbare Produkte, die leicht an die verschiedenen Raumgegebenheiten angepasst werden können. Dadurch werden sie trotz industrieller Fertigung den Bedürfnissen der Benutzer gerecht.

Diese neue Sichtweise des „Büros“ offenbart große Gestaltungsfreiheit: verschiedene Einrichtungsgegenstände werden in variablen Modulen zusammengestellt, Materialien und Ausführungen frei gewählt und Stoffe mit anderen Materialien zu ausdrucksstarken Kombinationen vereint. Dies schafft fließenden Übergänge innerhalb der Räume.

Auch ein Bürostuhl kann daher nicht mehr nur als „fertiges“ Modell angeboten werden, sondern muss die Möglichkeit bieten, die einzelnen Komponenten – Rückenlehne, Armlehnen, Gestell – aber auch verschiedene Bezugsstoffe frei zu wählen. Dadurch entsteht ein vielseitig einsetzbares Produkt, sozusagen eine „Stuhlfamilie“, die sich an die verschiedensten Raumgegebenheiten und Bedürfnisse anpassen lässt: Warte Räume, Besprechungszimmer, Direktionsbüros oder Arbeitsplätze für Angestellte können damit ausgestattet werden.

Lapalmas breit gefächertes Angebot bietet die Möglichkeit Schreib- oder andere Tische mit unterschiedlichen Höhen, Stauraumelemente und verschiedenes Zubehör zu kombinieren, um das Büro den eigenen Bedürfnissen und dem Zeitgeist entsprechend einzurichten.

Lapalma denkt das „Büro“ neu - modern und unkompliziert - mit einer aufs Minimum beschränkten Einrichtung, die jedoch durch besondere Details, ausgefallene Materialien oder Farben besticht.

Mit der neuen Produktlinie für das „Light Office“ zielt Lapalma auf ein neues Konzept für den Arbeitsplatz ab: Hierarchien lösen sich auf, die einzelnen Aufgabenbereiche sind nicht mehr streng getrennt und Komfort sowie die Möglichkeit zu informeller Begegnung werden immer wichtiger. So sitzt der Kunde auf einer gepolsterten Bank, Dokumente werden in farbenfrohen Schränken aufbewahrt und Kabel „versteckt“. Das „Büro“ hat sich ganz einfach verändert: times are changing, office is light !

LES TEMPS VONT CHANGER, LE BUREAU EST LIGHT !

Les lieux de travail contemporains sont en pleine mutation. A l'ère d'une société en mouvement, fluide comme de l'eau, le bureau a lui aussi changé d'aspect pour s'adapter aux nouvelles façons de travailler, aux nouvelles technologies et pour accompagner les nouveaux rythmes de vie des personnes. Le lieu de travail n'est plus un espace traditionnel avec des stations alignées, mais un espace articulé, léger, multifonctionnel, évolutif et flexible : est né le Light office.

Lapalma a su accueillir ce changement en proposant des produits transversaux qui s'adaptent facilement aux besoins de ces espaces grâce à un procès d'industrialisation dit «custom oriented».

Ceci est la nouvelle conception du Light office, qui réunit avec une grande liberté meubles et assises modulables, mixte différents choix de couleurs et de textures, assemble tissus et matériaux, compose des espaces fluides.

Une chaise de bureau, donc, ne se déclinera pas en une seule version. Grâce à la possibilité de changer chaque partie (dossier, accoudoirs, piètements, tissus, matériaux), la chaise devient une famille de produits adaptables capable de répondre à plusieurs configurations : salle d'attente, salle réunion, siège de direction, poste de travail.

Les produits Lapalma, peuvent être composés avec une grande flexibilité : éléments, bureaux et tables de différentes hauteurs, éléments conteneurs, accessoires fonctionnels sont là pour créer un bureau sur mesure et de grande actualité. Lapalma décline un bureau contemporain et astucieux qui s'enrichit de détails, de matériaux et d'un vaste choix de couleurs.

Dans la gamme de produits pensés pour le Light Office, Lapalma propose un nouveau concept d'espace de travail, dans lequel les hiérarchies s'estompent, les fonctions ne sont plus rigidement séparées, où le confort devient informel et démocratique : le client est assis dans une banquette rembourrée, les documents sont classés dans des armoires colorées, les câbles stockés dans des conteneurs adaptés. Avec légèreté le bureau a changé : les temps ont changé et le bureau est devenu light !

Anderssen & Voll is an Oslo based design-studio run by Torbjørn Anderssen (1976) and Espen Voll (1965). Torbjørn is graduated from The Bergen Academy of Art and Design and Espen is graduated from Oslo National Academy of the Arts. As cofounders of Norway Says in 2000, they were forerunners in a emerging international movement amongst young Norwegian designers. Since the startup of Anderssen & Voll in 2009, their work has spanned from textile design through tableware, lighting and furniture to electronics for some of Europe's most renowned international design Brands. Their collaborations include work for companies like Lapalma, Muuto, Wrong for Hay, Foscarini, Kvadrat, Erik Jørgensen and Filip Technologies. Shin Azumi's works have received numerous design awards in Europe and in Japan, including; FX International Design Award "Product of the Year" (UK), V&A Homes & Gardens Classic Design Award (UK), Good Design Award Best one hundred (JP), Classic Innovation Award 'Best of the Best' (DE), etc. His works have been added to the collection of many museums including the Victoria & Albert Museum (UK), Stedelijk Museum (Holland), Crafts-Council (UK), Die Neue Sammlung (Germany), Museum für Angewandte Kunst Frankfurt (Germany) as well as others. He is a visiting professor of Osaka University of Arts, and Kobe Design University and also a lecturer at Vitra Design Museum Workshops. She studied architecture and interior design at Kyoto City University of Art, worked in architectural studio in Tokyo, then moved to London in 1992. She finished a master course of Furniture Design at the Royal College of Art in 1995. After her activities as a partnership AZUMI (1995-2004), she started her own practice TNA Design Studio in East London in 2005. At TNA Design Studio, her main fields are furniture, lighting products, interior design and exhibition space design. She has been collaborating with international clients such as Benchmark Furniture (UK), Lapalma (Italy), Maxray (Japan), Röthlisberger (Switzerland) and Swarovski (Austria), as well as interior design for The Supreme Court of United Kingdom, shops for Harrys London and exhibition designs for the Crafts Council (UK). Her works are in several permanent collections include Victoria & Albert Museum and Geoffrey Museum in London and Stedelijk Museum (Netherlands). She has been a project teacher at the Design Products of Royal College of Art since 2005 and a research fellow at London Metropolitan University from 2006 to 2009.
